### City Parish News

Interesting Budget of Happenings Gathered by Our City Reporter

**St. Peter and Paul.**  
Masses on Sunday will be held at 6:30, 8:15, 9:30 and high mass at 10:45 o'clock.

At the request of the Young Ladies' Sodality a requiem mass was celebrated on Monday morning for Miss Elizabeth Voelkel.

On Wednesday morning at 7 o'clock a requiem high mass was celebrated for Mrs. Mary Meyers Danzer, an offering of Branch 62, L. C. B. A.

On Thursday morning at 8 o'clock a high mass of Thanksgiving was celebrated for all members of the parish.

Friday morning at 7 o'clock a requiem high mass was celebrated for all deceased members of the C. R. & B. A.

The nomination and election of officers of Ladies' Auxiliary, No. 44, will take place on Monday evening, Dec. 1st, when all members are expected to attend.

The regular meeting of Branch 62, L. C. B. A., will be held on Thursday evening, Dec. 4th, when assessment 358 will expire. At the last meeting the following committee was appointed to draft resolutions on the death of Mrs. Mary Danzer: Louise Bilger, Margaret Reger and Teresa Schreiner. The prizes for Pedro were won by Hattie Biety, Margaret Carlin and the consolation prize went to M. Reger.

### Sacred Heart.

In celebration of the eighth anniversary of the dedication of this church Sunday, announcement was made at all the masses of the cancellation of the mortgage on the church property and the parish began its campaign for a new church unhampered by any past indebtedness.

The Rev. George V. Burns organized the parish and built a new combination church and school. The structure was dedicated November 26, 1911. Since then this parish has contributed \$163,505.91 for church work. It has wiped out a debt of \$47,261.54, has paid more than \$12,000 in interest on notes and mortgages and has paid \$58,000 for property buildings and equipment. Contributions for diocesan collections and the like have totaled \$11,305.31. This parish has \$3,000 invested in Liberty bonds and \$700 more in War Saving Stamps.

In the war 130 members of the parish answered the call to the colors. Six were killed or died in service and many were wounded or laid low by disease.

Since the organization of the parish these men have been trustees: Rt. Rev. Thomas F. Hickey, D. D., bishop of the diocese; Rev. George V. Burns, R. W. Cook, M. J. Culhane, George Metzger and James H. Hanna.

In the eight years of the life of the parish these have been assistant rectors of the church: Rev. Frank W. Mason, Rev. J. W. Tischer, Rev. Frank Luddy and Rev. Daniel O'Rourke. Father Burns has continued as rector since the organization.

The parish owns the site in Flower City park and recently purchased a strip from the rear of the lots adjoining on Clay avenue. Plans are maturing for the new church and a suitable rectory adjoining. The new church ready, the present structure will be devoted exclusively to school use.

Miss Grace Hillen and David A. Dowd were married last Saturday afternoon at this church by Rev. G. V. Burns. The attendants were Mr. and Mrs. Louis Haefle, sister and brother-in-law of the bride. After an Eastern trip Mr. and Mrs. Dowd will be at home at No. 793 Flower City park.

Prenuptial events included a variety shower by the groom's sisters at the home of Mrs. R. Werner, No. 31 Ringle street, and a linen shower by the sisters of the bride.
