Golden Jubilee at Nazareth Convent.

On Sunday morning, December 28th, the Golden Jubilee of Sister Mary Evangelist Haggerty, was celebrated at Nazareth Convent in Jay street. The convent chapel, tastefully decorated with Christmas greens and floral pieces, wore an air of joyful festivity for the occasion. The solemn mass was sung by Rev. J. Francis O'Hern of the Cathedral, assisted by Rev. P. Moffat and Rev. V. O'Connor of St. Bernard's Seminary as deacon and sub-deacon, and Rev. Wm. Bergan of the Cathedral as Master of Ceremonies. Rev. M. J. Nolan, D. D., and Rev. Charles Bruton were also present in the sanctuary.

Rt. Rev. Thos. F. Hickey, D. D., occupied the episcopal throne during the Mass, and at its conclusion addressed a few words of congratulation to the Jubilarian. In his remarks the Bishop spoke most feelingly and appreciatingly of the inestimable value of so many years spent in religion in the service of God and the neighbor; while he fully realized that to reach the golden milestone in religious life is an unusual occurrence and as such is deserving of all honor, yet he would not wound the sensitiveness and delicate modesty of the Jubilarian by any words of praise; rather would he pray God to bless her with His choicest blessings in this life and grant her the fulness of reward in the life to come. The Bishop concluded his remarks with an earnest prayer that God would send laborers into His vineyard, that the good works of the community may go on uninterrupted.

Sister Evangelist received the habit of the Sisters of St. Joseph on December 28th, 1869 in the chapel of St. Mary's Boys' Asylum in West Avenue, then the sole institution of the Sisterhood in Rochester. During the past half century, she has seen the wonderful growth of the Order from a community of some thirty members to one numbering nearly six hundred; she has seen its charitable and educational institutions increase on all sides until today they are spread throughout the Diocese of Rochester. Sister Evangelist, who has at various times occupied positions of trust in her community, is now stationed in Elmira, N. Y.

A sister of the Jubilarian, Sister Mary Benedict of Nazareth Convent, and her two nieces, Sister Mary John of St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, and Sister M. Carmelita of St. Patrick's Convent, Danville, were with her for the occasion.

Sister M. Austin Glynn is Buried

The funeral of Sister M. Austin Glynn took place on Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock from the chapel of St. Mary's Boys' Asylum, in Main street west. The solemn mass of requiem was celebrated by Rev. Emil Gefell, M. R., of St. Peter and Paul's Church, as deacon, and Rev. A. A. Hughes, M. R., of Holy Rosary, as sub-deacon.

The interment was made in Holy Sepulcher cemetery. Sisters bore the body from the hearse to the grave, where the last blessing was given by Rev. E. Gefell.
