Former Organist of St. Joseph's Church For Forty Seven Years Is Laid to Rest.

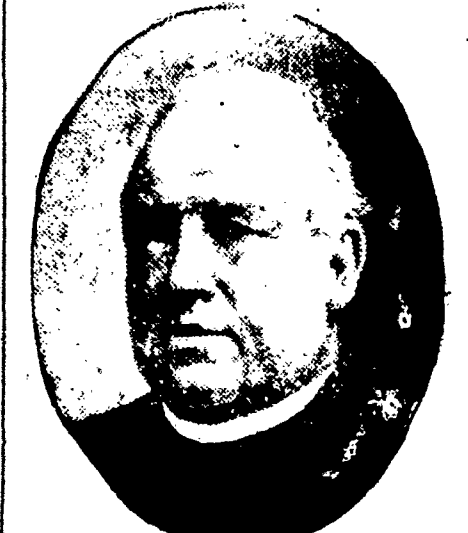

details of the progress of the work. In all public squares there were thermometers, nine feet high, announcing the results. Parishes, schools, clubs, business organizations, women's associations, etc., had their special teams. Many ladies gave not only money, but even their jewels. More than 5,000 Socialists in Buenos Aires declared their acceptance of the principles governing this great work, as they understood that its purposes, if realized, would yield them larger returns than any of the wild promises of agitators.

It is gratifying to learn that at this time of universal social upheaval our brethren of the faith in the Argentine Republic are making such splendid efforts to bring about the era of Christian justice and charity. Their project was successful beyond all expectation. The promoters looked forward to realizing a sum of \$10,000,000. But Buenos Aires alone subscribed \$13,000,000, while the provinces and country districts had not yet reported when the account on which this paper is based had been written. Their work is an example of that fine solidarity that should bind all our workers in the common cause of renewing all things in Christ. May our own endeavors along this line be blessed with the measure of success that crowned that of the Catholics of Argentine.
