Free Ireland

Bishop Hickey Looks For Independence.

St. Patrick's Day was celebrated at St. Patrick's Cathedral on Wednesday morning with solemn pontifical mass by Bishop Hickey, assisted by the clergy of the diocese. Members of the clergy from the various parishes of the city occupied places in the sanctuary, and seats in the congregation were reserved for members of the sisterhoods, representatives of various Catholic societies, pupils of the Rochester Catholic High School and of the upper grades of the Cathedral School. The students of St. Bernard's Seminary composed the sanctuary choir, and the Cathedral men's and boys' choirs were in the organ loft.

The whole interior of the Cathedral was decorated with American and Irish flags, and a halo of green lights surrounded the head of the statue of St. Patrick.

The orator of the day was Rev. Dr. Patrick Guilday of Washington, D. C., who delivered a panegyric on St. Patrick, in which he expressed the belief that the fondest hopes of Ireland are soon to be realized.

Bishop Hickey spoke as follows: "I look forward patiently and hopefully to the day when Ireland may obtain that full measure of independence which will place her before the world in a manner enabling her men and women to prove their fitness and ability to rule themselves, a hope which they have cherished for centuries."

"In the great movement for construction in Ireland along commercial, industrial and educational lines," said the Bishop, "there is something that calls for the hearty support and sympathy of every American citizen. As one of them, bearing the Irish blood in my veins, who has had the privilege of visiting her shores and meeting her bishops, her priests and her people, I hope and pray that she may enjoy soon the greatest prosperity with every blessing, and to that end I am prepared to contribute my voice and my money."

"In bringing this about, we urge and expect that no means will ever be used which would be contrary to the laws of God and which would fail to receive the respect and confidence of the great civilized nations of the world."

Fourth Degree Knights Plan Exemplification Sunday in Geneva.

Geneva.—William T. Connor, of Rochester, master of the fourth degree assembly of the Fifth New York district of the Knights of Columbus, through Louis H. Guard, F. N., has announced that the plans for the exemplification of the fourth degree in this city next Sunday afternoon have been completed.

The knights will attend mass at St. Francis de Sales Church at 10:30 o'clock. The exemplification of the degree will take place in the Armory at 2:30 o'clock, and all candidates must report at 1:30 o'clock. A supper will follow the exemplification of the degree at the Armory. A district meeting of the assembly of the Fifth district will take place at the Hotel Seneca at 1 o'clock.

The headquarters of Mr. Connor will be at the Hotel Seneca and the Knights of Columbus rooms will be used for the assembling of the members. All members of the order are requested to report at the Knights of Columbus rooms as soon as possible after arriving in the city. In addition to the fourth degree knights and the candidates, all members of the order are requested to assemble at the rooms on Sunday morning at 10 o'clock

and march in a body to the church, where a solemn high mass will be celebrated and special music will be rendered by the choir.

It is expected that the degree will attract a large gathering of members from Monroe, Ontario, Cayuga, Wayne, Seneca, Oswego, Yates and Livingston counties, which are included in Fifth district.

IRISH BOND DRIVE

When the Irish bond drive ends Saturday night it is rumored that some sort of an appropriate celebration will be given. Of course the send-off will be all the more lively if Rochester goes "over the top", but those in charge of the campaign believe there is little question but that the quota of \$50,000 will even be exceeded by several thousand, especially when returns from the county are received. It was announced today that the total for the city had already passed \$35,000.

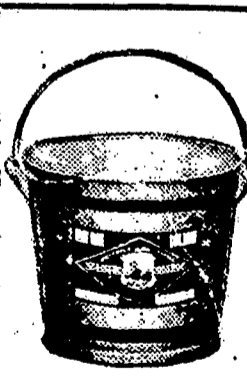
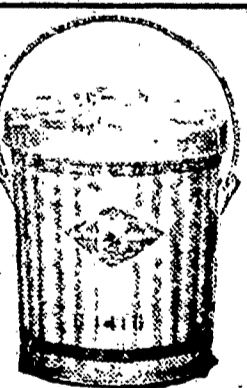

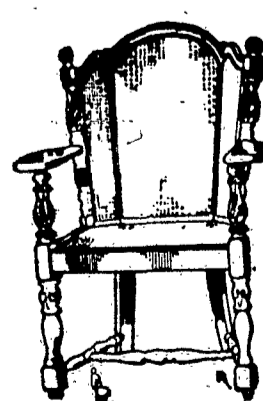
