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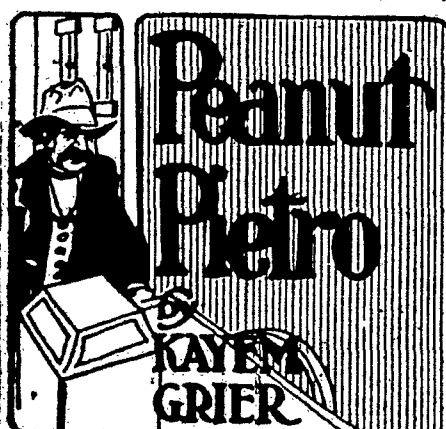

To speak frankly, there is a deal of bunk about most of us. Some bunk is justifiable as when we try to cover up a bit of charity that we do not care to be public property. But most "bunk" is unjustifiable. The business men, the professional men, the actors, the society leaders all deal in bunk to a greater or less extent. This is especially true of the hired propagandist, who goes about seeking to make men and women believe that black is white and vice versa. The political propagandist who seeks to convey the idea that his candidate and his cause are the only ones that can save the country from dire ruin is a skilled bunk artist and not unfrequently within a decade he has backed half a dozen different candidates on diametrically opposite platforms, all of which failed, and yet the country did not go to the demerition bow-wows. And, also not infrequently, the propagandists propaganda was successful and the country did come near to national bankruptcy.

If only the American people were more foresighted and less hysterical and confiding! They would discount the bunk and make the bunk artist flee their wrath. Washington and the National Capitol, the state capitols, "the welfare organizations", so-called, are all loaded to the gunwale with bunk distributed by very efficient bunk artists but very inefficient public servants. Universal panaceas guaranteed to cure all the ills of the body politic abound and nine out of every ten are as worthless as the average proprietary patent medicine nostrum.

But as long as the American people—at least those who make the most noise—continue as steady and liberal absorbers of bunk just so long will the bunk artist crop be a huge one.

Those who raise rents may not think they are profiteers but then we are all permitted to have our own opinion.
