### Musa Caravan Plan Ceremonial

## Cable Notes

Premier Millerand of France has appointed Deputy Jonnard Ambassador Extraordinary to the Vatican to settle numerous delicate and important questions definitively. The French government has sent its thanks to Bishop Padeborn for his assistance in tracing 323,000 prisoners and has accepted records from the German Catholic hierarchy.

Mountjoy Prison has surrendered. The campaign waged by the Irish against its severities has brought about an amendment of its rules which will permit special food and books being given prisoners and also allow of their receiving relatives and servants.

The Pope has sent thanks to the Archbishop of Dublin for a donation of 71,000 lire of Peter's Pence and a donation of 210,000 lire for the benefit of Europe's starving children.

The Irish hierarchy has not been summoned to Rome as a body for the beatification of Ven. Oliver Plunket, but many members of the hierarchy are going as individuals.

Rome, April 28th:—Cardinal O'Connell of Boston has arrived in Rome on his official visit to the Holy See. Cardinal Bourne of Westminster has so far recovered from the effects of his recent illness that he is now expected to be here early in May.

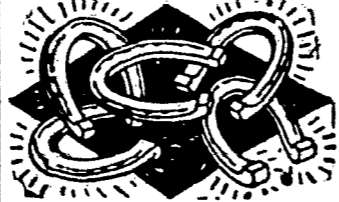
The diplomatic conversations looking to restoration of official relations between France and the Holy See are proceeding satisfactorily. It is now practically certain that France will be represented at the canonization of Joan of Arc by an Ambassador—probably Jonnard. It is expected that Jonnard will come on this special mission and that he later will be replaced by a permanent representative.

The Bishops of Chile have issued a pastoral letter directing priests to require civil marriage as well as the religious ceremony.

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## Baseball Season To Open.

The opening game of the Rochester Base Ball Club against the Syracuse team will be held at the grounds Bay street, Wednesday, May 5th. The game will be called at 4 o'clock and the opening ball will be tossed by Hon. William W. Hibbard, president of the Common Council. If the weather should be fine a record crowd will be in attendance.

President Chapin has got together a particularly fine set of boys who have so far acquitted themselves well. The usual parade will take place before the game. Among those who will take part are Honorable Hiram H. Edgerton, Mayor of Rochester, William H. Hibbard, president of the Common Council, all the members of the Board of Alderman and other dignitaries and well known citizens.

**Take Care of Good Books.**  
At spring cleaning time every book should be dusted separately and a fine, soft brush whisked in all the crevices where dust may lodge. Keep in the library, also, some transparent adhesive tape and a pair of sharp scissors; you can mend a torn magazine cover in a jiffy, or a book page that someone has torn. You can mend with the adhesive tape pages of music, and can straighten out bent corners of playing cards, putting a tiny section of the tape under the corner.

**Monopoly of Mocha Sheepskins.**  
The world's supply of Mocha sheepskin is obtained by about a dozen buyers, who have their native collectors in caravans to collect the skins at various centers, of which Mocha, Berbera, Zeylah and Hodeidah are the main points, from which they are sent to Aden, a British coaling station, which, on account of the exact location, is the shipping point for skins sent to London, the continent of Europe, and the United States.

**The Blanks Explained.**  
A strange phenomenon was observed when taking some exceptionally rapid pictures in New Jersey recently; every third film was found to be blank and on inquiring into the cause it was discovered that alternating current had been used for illumination and that the novograph had actually photographed the alternations of the current, which are too rapid to be perceived by the eye.

**Three Hundred Years Ago.**  
The first man to recognize the importance of roads in relation to civic progress was Lord Francis Bacon. He wrote three hundred years ago that three elements were necessary to the growth of a community—fertile soil, busy workshops and easy conveyance of men and things, from one place to another.

**Lady-Slipper.**  
Three of the well-known varieties of the beautiful orchid found in the temperate zone are called the pink lady-slipper, the yellow moccasin flower, and the showy lady-slipper which is white with purplish pink or crimson stripes. These names have been given the flowers as they bear a curious resemblance to a slipper.

**Pollen Carried Far by Wind.**  
Wind-blown pollen ("sulphur rain") is known to be carried far. Hesselman, of the Swedish experiment station, reports a quite extensive rain of tree pollen on two fire ships 20 and 37 miles from shore; and the pollen of algae is known to have been carried even as far as 200 miles.

## Electric Heating Pads

Speaking of heating pads, here are a couple of important reasons why the Electric Heating Pad is best:
