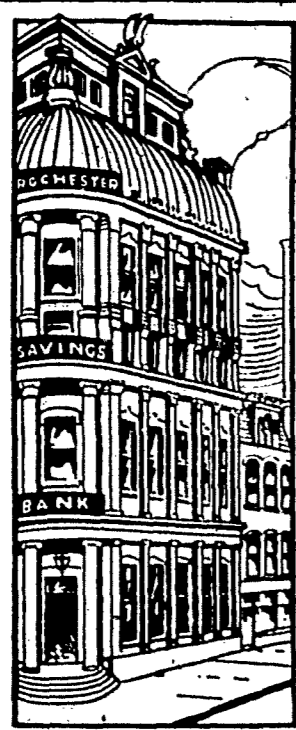

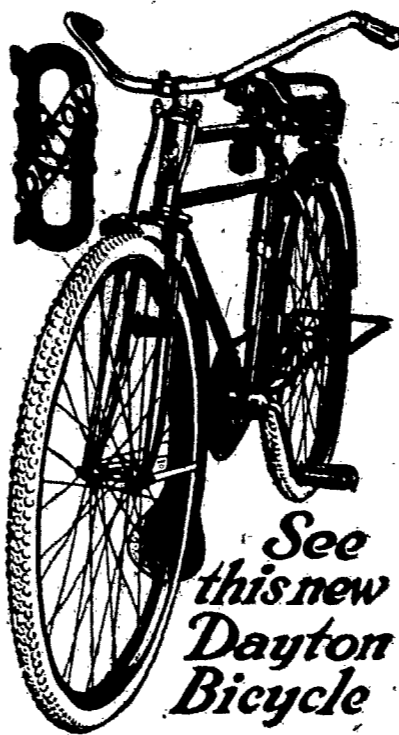
Sunday at all the masses an extra collection will be taken up for the improvements of the church.

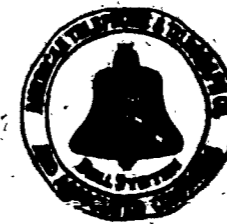
