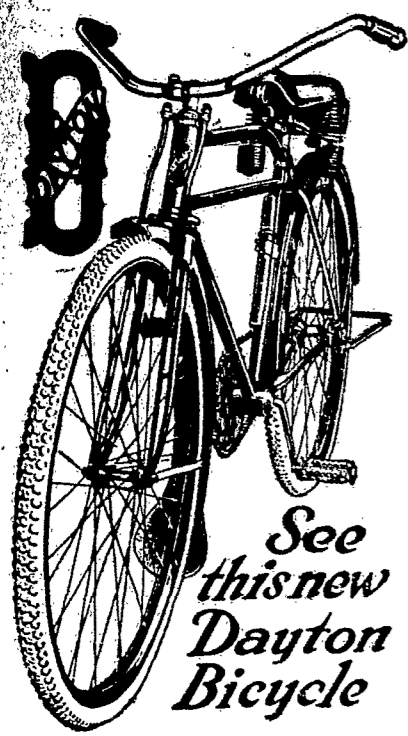

Honey Yield Higher.
The average yield of surplus honey in 1919 was 50 pounds to a colony of honey bees, as estimated by the bureau of crop estimates, United States department of agriculture. This is considerably above average of 45 pounds in 1918, and of 41.610 pounds for the five years 1915-1917. The relative proportions in which the honey of the last two years was marketed are indicated by 59 for extracted honey, 31 for comb honey and 10 for bulk honey. About one-third of the product goes to "outside" markets.

Saturday, May 29th.

The annual ordination of the young priests graduating from St. Bernard's Seminary will take place at the Cathedral Saturday morning, May 29th, at 9 o'clock. The ordaining prelate, the Right Rev. John Grimes, D. D., Bishop of Syracuse, will be attended by Mgr. J. J. Hartley, Rev. J. F. O'Hern, and Mgr. A. B. Meehan.

Possibility That They Will Yet Take the Place of the Old Photograph Album.

Some persons are already making pictures of their children at regular intervals. They fasten pictures together to make a continuous strip of film that in future years will be a valuable family record.
