

Two New Homes For Sisters

The Michael Doyle property at 321 Lake avenue, consisting of a large house and a commodious lot, has been purchased for the sisters who teach in the Cathedral grammar school and the Rochester Catholic High School. The property was purchased from Mr. Doyle by Joseph P. Brennan and the sisters will take possession about July 1, the purchase having been passed upon by the trustees of St. Patrick's Church Society.

The property is conceded to be one of the finest in the city. The house, which was built about 25 years ago, is splendidly constructed and will offer accommodations for about 25 religious. It includes ample room for a chapel and community rooms in addition to affording adequate sleeping accommodations. A caretaker's house is located in the rear.

Announcement of the purchase of the property follows closely upon the sale by William H. Briggs of the house and lot at 22 Lake View Park to the Sisters of Nazareth Academy. The Briggs house was built in 1831 by Lindley Murray Moore and was used in the early 60's as a sanatorium by a Dr. Biegler. The sisters will take possession of this property on July 1.
