ANNUAL RETREAT FOR LAYMEN

Will Be Opened at St. Bernard's Seminary on August 13th.

Invitations are being sent to the Catholic laymen of Rochester and the larger cities of the diocese, such as Geneva, Auburn, Elmira and Corning, for the laymen's annual retreat, which will open at St. Bernard's Seminary on Friday evening, August 13th, and continue to Monday morning, August 18th.

The exercises will be conducted by Rev. J. H. Healy, O. P., of New York, Dominican missionary who has preached in all parts of the United States and who is expected to be a popular and interesting lecturer with a forceful presentation of the subject matter of the meditations, which will be of a varied character.

Registration for the retreat may be made with the pastors of the Catholic churches or with Mr. Charles P. Maloy, No. 209 Linden street, secretary of the Retreatant's Association. The other officers selected at the close of last year's exercises are Frank X. Kelly, president, and William J. Hauser, treasurer.

New Department for the Training of Vocational Teachers at the Buffalo State Normal School

The Board of Trustees of the State College for Teachers at Albany have voted to transfer \$30,000 worth of mechanical equipment and five men from the faculty to the Buffalo State Normal School so that a new department of Teacher Training Vocational work may be instituted at Buffalo. The Buffalo Normal School already has considerable equipment which will be used for this work and the state appropriation passed by the last Legislature carries an additional \$18,000

which will be used for making an excellent selection of mechanical equipment to be used in this department. High School graduates are eligible for this training and in a course of two years of day work will be prepared as Industrial Teachers in Machine Shop, Woodworking and Cabinet

Making, Electricity, Sheet Metal Work and Printing. This department is open to men only and its success seems immediately assured. The Trustees of the State College for Teachers at Albany made this transfer of the department to Buffalo because of the large number of varied industries located in the "Queen City" and because of the further fact that within a radius of seventy miles from Buffalo there are fourteen important industrial centers.

Buffalo also boasts one of the best Vocational Systems of schools in the United States. The Head of the new Teacher Training Department is Mr. I. C. Perkins, formerly Vocational Director of the State of Rhode Island. Mr. Perkins principal of H. W. Rockwell of the Buffalo State Normal School will gladly furnish additional information regarding the new department.
