Horse Show and Exposition Next Week

Rochester is ready and waiting to welcome all Western New York to her 1920 Exposition and nationally famous Horse Show, opening at Exposition Park on Labor Day, September 6th, for a full week.

Among the chief features of the Exposition proper will be the daily concerts by Pershing's Own Band, the organization which made itself famous in France just before the close of the war, and later on in England. This band will be heard in conjunction with an encampment of an entire company of the 63rd Infantry, U. S. Army, ordered to the Exposition by the War Department for the week. These picked regulars of the standing army will be seen in exhibition drills and military ceremonies daily.

As the closing attraction each night of the Exposition there will be a spectacular pageant on a special stage erected at the Plaza, in which production more than 200 performers will take part, assisted by the Exposition's massed bands. It is promised that this historical dance and costume performance will be a most entertaining and unique show of its kind.

Government war and educational exhibits, a big Flower Show, displays by various State departments, horticultural and agricultural exhibits, fine arts, industrial hall, free open-air shows, a mammoth midway and hosts of other attractions are scheduled.

With \$15,000 in cash prizes and close to \$5,000 in silver trophies to be awarded to the winners in what has come to be recognized everywhere as the greatest Horse Show in America, this year's show has attracted all of the old favorites of other seasons as well as many new.

Two Fires In St. Mary's Orphan Asylum

A piece of tar paper that had been inserted in a partition on the third floor of the main building of St. Mary's Boys' Orphan Asylum, 6 Genesee street, was lighted Thursday morning about 10 o'clock, when nearly all the boys were on the playground. One of the boys saw smoke issuing from a third-story window, and running to box 326, asked a man who was passing to turn in an alarm.

When Battalion Chief Smith and firemen reached the asylum the sisters who are in charge there had nearly extinguished the flames with chemicals. The firemen did the rest. Chief Smith discovered the burned tar paper. It is suspected that a thoughtless boy set fire to the paper in the hope of playing the hero. Damage of \$50 was done.

Dudley Field Malone To Speak

The first statewide Farmer-Labor party conference will be held in Rochester next Sunday. Morning and afternoon sessions will be held at the Seneca Hotel, and in the evening at 8 there will be a public mass meeting at Convention Hall.

The chief speaker will be Dudley Field Malone, who is well known throughout the State and the country through his activities in the Democratic party in former years. It will be remembered that four years ago, Dudley Malone was the Chief Speaker and Adviser of the Wilson Campaign. It is generally accepted that through Mr. Malone's marvelous ability as a speaker that California and other western states were carried for President Wilson. Mr. Malone became the intimate friend of the President and was later appointed as collector of the port of New York. In 1917 he resigned from this lucrative position, giving as a reason the fact that the President had broken his pledges to the women of the west, whom he had promised to do everything in his power to aid the National Suffrage Amendment. Mr. Malone later severed his entire connection with the party. Since that time he has been one of the strongest exponents of the Constitutional Rights of American Citizens. He has also been closely connected with the Friends of Irish Freedom and has spoken in all large cities for the Irish cause. Mr. Malone is the Farmer-Labor Candidate for Governor.

The second speaker will be Miss Rose Schneiderman who needs no introduction to the citizens of New York State. She has been one of the Chief figures in the labor movement in America.
