The first step of the all Russian Congress of soviets in Petrograd was to strike a blow at this principle by forbidding the teaching of religion in any school, public or private, through: out Soviet Russia. All churches or ecclesiastical societies were forbidden to hold or bequeath property. All memers of any church of religious organiz ition were disfranchised.

"The attitude of Soviet Russia in regard to religion was clearly emphasized by Bucharia, editor of the Pravada, when he wrote: "There are some soft-headed Communists who say that their religion does not prevent hem fro inbeing Communities. They them from being Communists. They say that they believe both in God and in Communism.' Such a view is fundamentally wrong; religion and Communism do not go together either in which protects the second generation.
