St. Bernard's Seminary Unit

Catholic Students' Mission Crusade

St. Bernard's Unit of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade is barely a year old, but its accomplishments for the first year bespeak the growth of a much more mature organization. Its first annual report has appeared and has caused as much surprise as it has drawn forth appreciation. The Unit at St. Bernard's has been almost exclusively a student institution, and although it has received some outside aid, the bulk of the contributions for the Missions has come from the student body at the Seminary. It seems as if each student, mindful of the watchword of the Crusades of Old—"God wills it", had determined to do his bit to build up a grand total of both spiritual and material aids for the Missioners.

As regards the spiritual part of the Unit's work, the printed report is silent, deeming an angel's pen in heaven far better suited to a record of this kind. Sufficient for us is it to say that for the year just ended over 190 students at the Seminary have offered up each Friday all their spiritual works, including Masses heard; Holy Communions received; Rosaries recited and innumerable prayers sent to the throne of God, that on earth His Kingdom Come. Each day after public recitation of the Rosary a prayer is added for the propagation of the Faith, and many private prayers are daily offered for the extension of God's Name among the heathens of our own and foreign countries. Travellers in mission

fields have been astounded at the rapid growth of the Catholic Faith with its all too few missioners, and very limited means; when they compare it with Protestantism in heathen lands, with its untold resources and its missioners having every comfort that money can buy. They cannot understand and ask the reason: "Why does the missionary of the Catholic faith so far outdistance his Protestant confrere in the mission field, for the non-Catholic missionary never wants for funds for church, hospital or asylum?" Catholics know the answer and so would all others if they but knew of the prayers without number that daily ascend from Convent, Seminary, Parochial School, and pious home throughout the land, for the spread of God's Name and the success of the efforts of all Catholics Missioners.

Almost \$590.00 passed through the treasury of St. Bernard's Unit since last May. About \$250.00 of that sum went directly to the Missions, being distributed; some to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith; some to Maryknoll, the American Catholic Foreign Mission Seminary; and the rest going to aid Missioners among the Indians of our own country and the peoples of the Philippine Islands. Nearly \$160.00 was expended by the members as subscriptions to the various missionary magazines, and \$60.00 was used to start a Mission Library at the Seminary for a wider diffusion of knowledge among things missionary. Over \$50.00 was sent to the Crusade Headquarters to help defray the expenses of the Executive Office in its missionary propaganda. These various amounts, together with a few others of less amount, make a total that would do justice to a society of a much larger field and a much larger membership. The Unit at St. Bernard's feels proud of their first report and also wishes to acknowledge certain gifts to the Unit since its inception. The unit is indebted to Mr. Joseph Weis for a very beautiful bookcase for its library, and to Mr. Albert Geiger for a handsome Bulletin Board, he made and donated to the Unit.
