Funeral of Bishop Gabriels

The funeral of Bishop Henry Gabriels of the diocese of Ogdensburg was held Thursday morning at St. Mary's Cathedral in Ogdensburg and was attended by many members of the clergy, including sixteen bishops. Archbishop Hayes, of New York, preached the sermon.

He referred to the work of Bishop Gabriels who had come to this country from the University of Louvain to take charge of St. Joseph's Seminary at Troy, and of his late work as bishop of the diocese of Ogdensburg, the number of which had doubled since the bishop succeeded the late Bishop Wadhams.

Archbishop Hayes said that the Pope had planned to honor the late bishop in September, the occasion of the sixtieth anniversary of the ordination of Bishop Gabriels. The body was placed in a crypt under the main altar where reposes the body of Bishop Wadhams. Auxiliary Archbishop Joseph Conroy was named by the counselors of the diocese as administrator.

K. of C. Players To Present "Under Cover"

This spring's performances of the Knights of Columbus Players will not be confined to Rochester. The organization, which is now well launched on rehearsals of Roi Cooper Megrue's big melodramatic success of several years ago, "Under Cover," will present the play one night in Warsaw before offering it here.

The appearance there will be under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus organization of that town. The date will be set about a week before the opening of the two-nights' engagement here in the Temple Theater, which will be in the latter part of May.

"Joy Car" Provided By Catholic Society For inmates of Institutions

The "joy car" of the Catholic Church Extension Society, which will be used as an excursion car for inmates of various charitable institutions in this city, made its first trip Sunday. The chassis of the car was built by the Selden Motor Vehicle Company. The car is large enough to seat comfortably 36 children or about thirty adults. On the blazing red sides of the vehicle the words "Joy Car" are stenciled.

Last Sunday the car merely made a trial spin, and no passengers were carried. The driver first called at Police Headquarters to give Police Chief Joseph M. Quigley an opportunity to inspect the car. The machine was then driven to the Dorsey Home for colored orphans, and later to the Monroe County Tuberculosis Sanatorium.
