FUNERAL SERVICES HELD FOR TWO SOLDIERS

Requiem mass was celebrated at St. Monica's Church Wednesday morning for Private Charles A. Dowd, jr., Co. M., 310th Infantry, and Musician Frederick J. Slager. Rev. John P. Brophy officiated, with Rev. J. C. Hogan as deacon and Rev. Edward Ball as subdeacon.

Funeral services took place at the home of Private Dowd, No. 217 Genesee street, at 9:30 o'clock. Services were conducted at the same hour at the home of Musician Slager, No. 645 Main street west.

Military honors were paid to the dead veterans in Holy Sepulcher cemetery, where the bodies of both were buried. A detail from Thomas F. Healy Post, Veterans of Foreign Wars, in charge of Adjutant H. L. Paddock, took charge of the final obsequies for Private Dowd, a squad firing three salutes and Bugler L. M. Livingston sounding taps as the body was lowered into the grave. Rev. Father Brophy conducted the final religious services.

The active bearers, who were in uniform, as were the members of the firing squad, were as follows: Harry Shillady, Frank Semple, Harry Simmons, Clarence Scott and Donald McIntosh. The firing squad was composed of Clarence Quinlan, John J. Perdue, John J. Grunley, Austin Carr, Earl Kanons, Terence O'Donnell, Thomas J. Rabbit and Charles Curry.

Six cousins of Musician Slager, all World War veterans, in uniform, bore the dead soldier's body to its last resting place. They were Edward Mullen, Vincent O'Connor, William Plant, John Plant, Roy Slager and Charles Hawkins. Rev. John McMahon conducted the services at the grave.

Archbishop Bonaventure Cerretti, whose appointment as Papal Nuncio to Paris marks the resumption of diplomatic relations between the French Republic and the Vatican after a lapse of fifteen years, has had a career of successful achievement in the service of the Church which, those who know him say, is founded purely on merit, a willingness to serve, and an unlimited capacity for work of the most exacting nature. He has served with distinction in the Papal diplomatic service in Mexico, the United States and Australia, and in the Secretariate of State at Rome.
