BISHOP McDONNELL IS DEAD

Head of Brooklyn Diocese Called To His Reward

Rt. Rev. Charles Edward McDonnell, Bishop of Brooklyn, died on Monday.

Bishop McDonnell was consecrated April 25, 1892, and was 67 years old. He was born in New York and educated by the Christian Brothers and by the Jesuits of St. Xavier's College, and at the American College in Rome.

He was ordained on May 19, 1878, and was assigned as an assistant to St. Mary's Church, New York. He then went to St. Stephen's and later served in St. Patrick's Cathedral, from 1879 to 1884.

He was secretary to Cardinal McCloskey and to Archbishop Corrigan. He was made Chancellor in 1885, serving until 1892, when he took charge of the Brooklyn diocese.
