**St. Bernard's Unit 50 YEARS A NUN**  
Golden Anniversary Is Celebrated  
With Solemn High Mass  
Corning, Aug. 17. — Sister Mary  
Berchmans, who has been a  
member of the Order of Mercy  
for fifty years, celebrated her  
golden anniversary at St. Mary's  
Church here to-day. Solemn high  
mass was celebrated by Rev. J. J.  
Griffin, assisted by Rev. W. J.  
Lee and Rev. John A. Conway,  
all of Corning, in the presence of  
a congregation made up of class-  
mates, friends and former pupils  
of the nun. Sister Berchmans  
has been connected with St.  
Mary's Parochial School here for  
forty-one years. Since 1897 she  
has been its principal. In that  
time she has taught several  
thousand of the city's youth. To-  
day's ceremony was a testimonial  
to her life and work here.  
As Miss Nellie Holway, daugh-  
ter of Joseph and Helen Holway,  
of Tonawanda, she entered the  
order as a novice in 1868 at St.  
Joseph's Convent in Batavia. She  
was received on June 23, 1869,  
and professed on August 17, 1871.  
After she had taught for eleven  
years at Albion she was sent to  
Corning, where she has since  
been stationed.
