Announcement will be made of the October devotions, which are held each evening at 7:45 in Lady Chapel and consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, litany, prayer to St. Joseph, and Benediction.

Announcement will also be made of the feasts of St. Francis Borgia, on Monday, of St. Edward, King, on Thursday, and of St. Theresa, Virgin, on Saturday.

At the Cathedral tomorrow Masses will be celebrated at 6, 7:30, 8:30, 9:30, and the late Mass, a low Mass, at 11 o'clock. Vespers, followed by Benediction will be celebrated at 7:30 o'clock in the evening. There will also be a sermon in connection with the evening services, on the topic "The Catholic Devotion of the Rosary"—its origin, history, and popularity.

Sunday School for the Cathedral school children will be held at 2 p. m., and the Girls' Sodality will hold their first monthly meeting at the same hour, following Benediction.

Sunday school for the public school children will be held in Cathedral School at 3 p. m. Sunday is Communion Sunday for the men of the parish, at the 7:30 o'clock Mass.

The masses on Sunday will be said at 6:45, 7:45, children's mass at 9:15 and high mass at 10:30 o'clock.

Requiem masses were said this week for: Philip Frank, John Rahner, Isador Hohman, Joseph Bertsch, and John Harter.

During the month of October Rosary Devotions will be held on Tuesday and Friday evenings at 7:45 o'clock.

On Sunday, October 30, Bishop Thomas F. Hickey will administer the sacrament of Confirmation at this church.
