All Soul's Day Observed in Dansville

Dansville, N. Y., Nov. 1.—Wednesday, the feast of the dead—All Souls' Day—commemorating those who have passed beyond the veil, particularly those who are suffering for a time in that vestibule of heaven, called Purgatory, was fittingly ushered in at St. Mary's church, Dansville, by special devotions Tuesday evening, together with sermons and the ceremony of the

blessing of the graves at the Catafalque. Especially striking was the bier enveloped with its black mantle and surmounted with lighted candles before which the Rev. Leo G. Hofschneider stood when conducting the religiously dramatic and solemn ceremony of the blessing of the graves, in prayers and special psalms, sending petitions heavenward while the choir sang the De Profundis and the Dies Irae.

Taking for his text, "From the morning watch even until night let Israel hope in the Lord," in his sermon the Rev. Pastor in magnetic voice, strong with feeling and impelling in its force led his hearers in spirit through the avenue of life to the deathbed and the grave—the last resting place of each where each remains awaiting the judgment day. He aptly portrayed the death of St. Monica whose dying request to her son St. Augustine was at the close of her career: "Place this body where you will, but remember me at the altar of God wherever you be." He prayed that a Christian is one that will willingly die as he has lived; that strengthened by God, enjoying the light of faith, the grace of prayer, when the summons comes death and the cold grave will have no horror for him.
