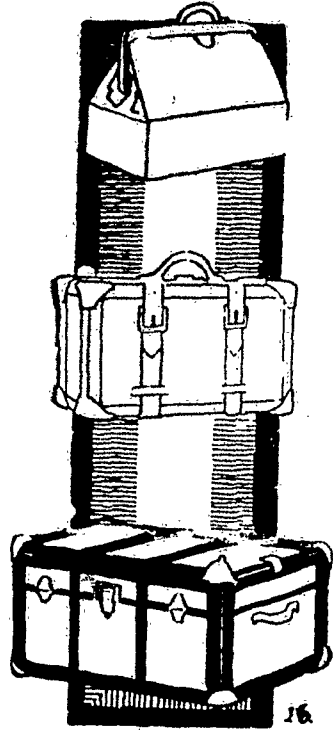

Weekly Calendar Of Feast Days

(By N. C. W. C. News Service.)

Sunday, Nov. 20.—St. Felix of Valois, who founded with St. John of Matha, the order of the Holy Trinity for the redemption of Christian captives. After a holy life he died in 1213.

Monday, Nov. 21.—The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin, when, according to tradition, Mary's parents brought her to the temple to offer her to God.

Tuesday, Nov. 22.—St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr, who, having consecrated her virginity to God, converted her husband Valerian, later martyred for the faith. Cecilia was condemned to be suffocated but after a day and night came through the ordeal unscathed. The licitor then sent to dispatch her struck her three blows and she lay for two days and nights on the pavement of her bath, with her head half severed, before expiring. She died in 177.

Wednesday, Nov. 23.—St. Clement of Rome, said to have been consecrated a bishop by St. Peter himself. Not only had he to contend with pagans, including the Emperor Domitian, but he had also to combat internecine strife among the Corinthian Christians. He addressed to them a notable epistle, restoring peace among them.

Thursday, Nov. 24.—St. John of the Cross, who entered the Carmelite Order in 1563 and became the first prior of the Barefooted Carmelites. Inspired by St. Theresa he did much for the reformation of the order.

Friday, Nov. 25.—St. Catherine, a noble virgin of Alexandria, who was accorded many visions. She was put to death by the soldiers of Maximin, whose suit she refused. It is related that angels carried her body to the grave in Mount Sinai.

Saturday, Nov. 26.—St. Leonard of Port Maurice, who takes his name from Porto Maurizio, Italy, where he was born in 1676. He joined the Riformella, a society similar to the Friars Minor and gave missions in his native city. His missionary works finally took him to all parts of Italy and the islands. He recommended particularly devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Way of the Cross, and wrote many sermons and books on the spiritual life. He died in Rome in 1751.

Nazareth Academy To Hold Music Course

Through the co-operation of the Eastman School of Music five recitals and three lectures on musical appreciation will be offered this winter in the assembly hall at Nazareth Academy in Lake avenue. The series will open on Tuesday evening, November 22d with a piano recital by Pierre Augieras, assisted by Lucile Davis, soprano.

A self-accompanied song recital by Arthur Alexander will follow on December 12th. The third recital will be on January 16th with Alf Klingenberg, pianist and director of the school, Gerald Kunz, violinist and Gerald Maas, cellist, as the performers. On February 6th, Raymond Wilson, will give a piano recital assisted by a violinist. A vocal quartette made up of Lucile Davis, soprano; Mildred Lewis, contralto; Charles Headley, tenor, and Frederick Benson, baritone, will appear February 27th assisted by Mr. Maas. Three lectures on musical appreciation will be given by George Barlow Penny on March 6th, 20th and April 3rd.
