

Father McCarthy To Become Pastor of New Catholic Church

A new Catholic Church to be known as St. Ambrose Church will be erected on Culver road, near Clifford avenue, and the Rev. Walter B. McCarthy will be the pastor, according to an announcement made by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey. It is planned to erect a temporary structure which will serve until a more substantial edifice is built. The temporary church will provide for about 400 persons.

Father McCarthy, who will organize the parish, was ordained in 1909. He has been at Brockport, Sonyea and Moravia and since last year has been serving as secretary at St. Bernard's Seminary. The trustees of the new church are Bishop Hickey, the Rt. Rev. D. J. Curran, Father McCarthy, George W. Henner and Raymond J. Tierney.
