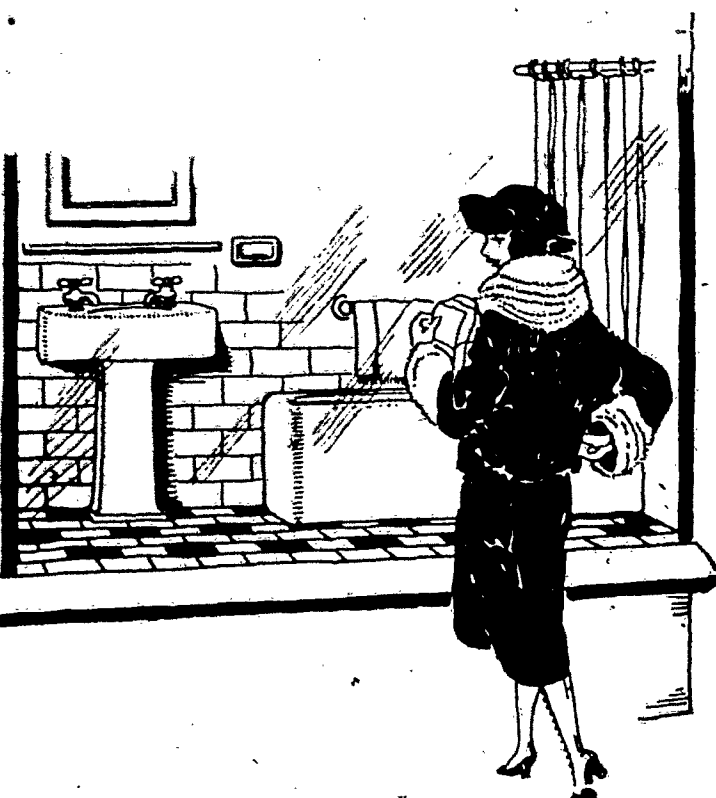

Bishop Declares**

A new Catholic high school is  
urgently needed in Rochester.  
This fact was pointed out Wed-  
nesday night by Bishop Thomas  
F. Hickey in an address to mem-  
bers of the alumni of the school  
at their annual dinner and re-  
union in Powers Hotel.

"I have now a few hundred  
dollars placed in my hands by  
friends as a nest egg," the bish-  
op said. "However, the building  
is the least of my concern. We  
will have money enough. The  
thing I am most concerned about  
is that the soul of the school shall  
be right. When this is ready, we  
will have a body. I feel sure that  
the citizens of Rochester will re-  
spond to the appeal for funds, in  
view of the contribution we make  
to the city's life."

ney, was the other speaker. He  
believed the young men from the  
Catholic High School were mak-  
ing a valuable contribution to the  
civic life of Rochester.

to the sisters in Catholic schools.

of the alumni, presided. Neil P.  
Collins led the singing. An enter-  
tainment was given.

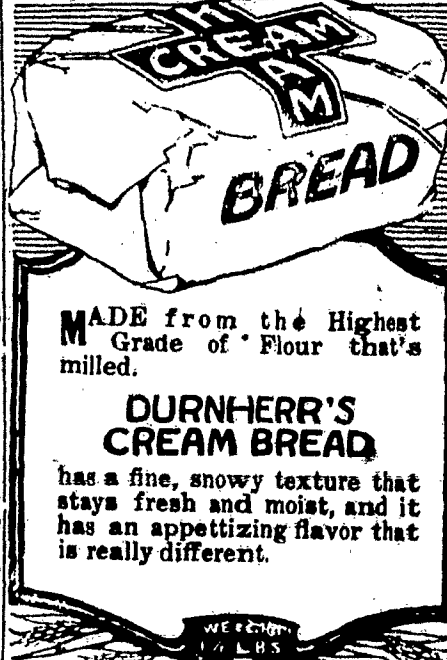
