## Priceless Records Of Belgian Colleges Lost During The War

Paris, Dec. 30.—It has now be-  
come possible to make known in  
detail the loss of records and his-  
torical documents suffered by  
Belgium during the war.

Quite apart from the archives of many cities, such as Dinant, Xuyres, Termonde, Furnes, etc., a large number of documents of ecclesiastical and monastic history have disappeared. Among them are the archives of the Abbey of Val-Saint-Lambert (647 registers and 2344 charts dating from 1050 to 1796), those of the Collegiale of Saint Denis (679 registers and 1009 charts of the eleventh to the eighteenth centuries) and those of the Collegiale of Saint-Martin of Liege (588 registers and 850 charts of the eleventh to the eighteenth century). At Arlon the Abbey of Clairefontaine lost 718 documents dating from 1163 to 1794 and the Abbey of Saint-Hubert lost 2103 documents dating from 1070 to 1794 and a series of maps and plans.

However, the most disastrous of all, was the loss of the archives of the Catholic University of Louvain.

New York, Jan. 9. — Pietro A. Yon, for the past fourteen years organist of the Jesuit Church of St. Francis Xavier in West Sixteenth Street has been designated as honorary organist at the Vatican, according to word received here from Monsignor Mariano Ugolini, prefect of the choir in the Julian chapel of St. Peter's. Monsignor Yon's reputation as an organist and composer is international. Before coming to New York he was for two years substitute organist at the Vatican and the Royal Church at Rome. He composed twenty-one masses and more than one hundred motets. He has given public organ recitals in over one hundred cities of the United States and in all principal cities of Europe.
