


A great cloud, floating in the sky, meets an upward draught of air and begins to rise rapidly. In most cases such a cloud would soon be turned to snow, for the higher you go the greater becomes the cold. If this happened in summer time the falling snow would be melted into fine rain by passing through warm air on its way to the earth.

But sometimes the cloud as it rises meets a blast of warm afr which carries it to a great height, and then makes its vapor condense into ruindrops. These drops begin to fall, and when they have fallen a little way they strike intensely cold air, which freezes them solid. Owing to their weight they fall so rapidly that there is not time for them to thaw as they pass through the warmer air near the ground. Hence they reach the earth In the form of little balls of ice



"TAMMANY"

HEN political reports stats that such-and-such a person is the "Tammany candidate". or that "the Tammany organization is back of a certain move," the expression is understood to refer to a prominent organization in New Tork-Dut the fact that it receives its name from a noted Indian chief is overlooked.

Tamanend, the chief in question," was the ancient, wise and friendly head of the Delaware tribe of Indians who, for want a better candidate. was "canonized" by the soldiers of the American Revolution as the patron saint of the new country. The Tammany organization dates from May 12, 1789, when It was formed for benevolent and social purposes, but eventually became an important political body, formally chartered in 1905 and opposing the socalled "aristocratic" Society of the Cincinnati. It was essentially anti-federalist or democratic in its character and its chief founder was William Mooney, an American upholterer of Irish extraction. The grand sachem and the thirteen schems typified the president and the governors of the thirteen original colonies.

The Tammany Society today is a charitable and social organization, entirely distinct from the general committee of the Tammany political body, which cannot use Tammany hall without the consent of the society.
