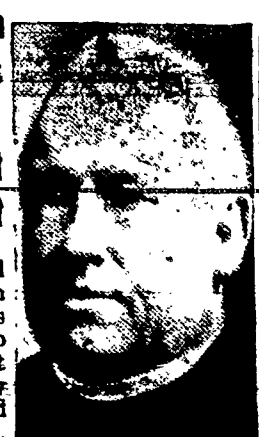

Plans For Catholic College Week

The plan to hold a "Catholic College Week" was approved at the meeting of the N. C. W. C. Department of Education on January 25, 1922.

Officials of all Catholic colleges, academies, preparatory schools, and high schools are urged to hold during college week some appropriate exercises designed to inspire in their pupils a desire for higher education.

Catholic pastors are requested to preach sermons at all masses on April 30 on the desirability of a larger support of the Catholic college, particularly by increased attendance, and to call to the attention of the Catholic youth and their parents the special benefits of college education in Catholic colleges.

Of approximately 450,000 students in all colleges in the United States, only about 50,000, or 15 per cent, are Catholics. There should be 90,000 Catholic students in colleges and, of course, the great majority of these should be in Catholic colleges.
