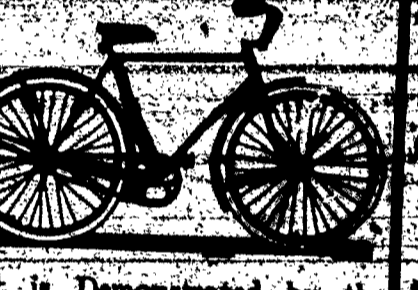
Seats were reserved for the families of the honored dead. The singers were led by their director, Professor Eugene F. Bonn, who has charge of the choir at the Cathedral.
