HOW

NATURE'S SYSTEM WORKS TO PROTECT THE SKIN. -Few things are more destructive to the tissues of the human body than strong sunlight. The harm is not done by the light visible to the eyes, but by certain rays that it contains. These are called ultra-violet rays, and are quite invisible. They cause sunstroke, soreness of the eyes and blistering or inflammation of the skin.

Scientists have found that the only thing that will stop their passage is a layer of yellowish or reddish color, which acts as a kind of filter, absorbing the ultra-violet rays and allowing others to pass. Red spectacles cannot be used because red rays also are injurious to the eyes: but nature has provided the Southern race with an effective skin protector in their color, which is really not black, but a dark reddish brown. Beneath the skins of all men

is a supply of a substance known as chromogen, which, under the action of the ultra-violet rays, turns into coloring matter or pigment. The pigment has four stages—yellow (white men), dark yellow (Chinese), red (American Indians), and brown (Indians and negroes). In white men the pigment has lost much of its power to respond to the ultra-violet rays, but strong aunlight still causes the skin to protect itself by assuming the color known as sunburn. Even the freckles whose presence on her nose so worries the pretty girl are en instance of Mother Nature's protecting hand.

The pigment of negroes, however, has become so susceptible to the influence of light that even those born in cold climates are black from birth to death. Once blackness or the skin has occurred it is very persistent. If negroes settled in Lapland, it would need many thousands of years for their descendants to change their color.
