# ASTONISHING AGE FOR HORSE

Animal Owned in the United Status Declared to Flave Lived for Fiftyens Years.

A horse owned by a United States clergyman named Meyers is probably the oldest of its kind, having reached the autonishing age of fifty-one years. Clover, as this remarkable beast is called, has astonished the experts by his feet in living for more than half a century. It is undoubtedly a world's record. The house surgeon at the Royal Veterinary college in London admitted that he had never heard of a case to equal it. "The oldest horse I ever knew," he said, "was a pony to the Midlands which lived to be thirtynine and which was at work until 13 months before its death.
