## Knights of St. John To Have Jubilee On Anniversary

St. Mauritius Commandery Knights of St. John, of this city will celebrate its fiftieth anniversary next Sunday and Monday. The founding of the Rochester order in 1873 marked the entrance of the Knights of St. John into the United States. The celebration of a solemn high mass at St. Joseph's Church on Sunday with a sermon by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey, supreme spiritual adviser of the national order, will open the ceremony. On the next day a solemn requiem mass will be said for the one hundred deceased members of the Commandery. The gathering will close with a banquet at the Osburn House.

St. Mauritius Commandery was organized on July 2, 1873 under the name of the German Catholic Union. Fifteen Rochester men, desirous of obtaining the advantages and benefits afforded to thousands of men and women today by the Knights of St. John, were the organizers. The original hand-written minutes of the body, still preserved, relate how the society rapidly expanded to a membership of 184 men, vitally interested in civic and religious activities of their time.

At the solemn high mass, which will open the anniversary meeting on Sunday in St. Joseph's Church, the rector of that church, Rev. John G. Baer, spiritual adviser of the commandery, will act as celebrant, with the chaplain of the Rochester regiment, Rev. M. J. Hargather, as deacon and the assistant regimental chaplain, Rev. John P. Schellhorn as subdeacon. Bishop Hickey will deliver the sermon. The commandery will be escorted by the First Regiment of the order. The members will receive holy communion in a body. Photographs will be taken after the ceremony and a general reception will follow.
