Sheppard-Towner Act Accepted By Idaho With Qualification

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Boise, Idaho, July 20. - Qualified acceptance of the Sheppard-Towner Act, providing federal aid in the care of maternity and infancy was voted by the Legislature of Idaho at its last session. After appropriating \$5,000 as the State's share of the expenses of administering the provisions of the Act, the Legislature appended the following provision to the bill providing for acceptance:

"Provided; that no official or agent or representative of the State in carrying out the provisions of this act or the said federal act shall enter any home or take charge of any child over the objection of the parents or either of them or the person standing in loco parentis or having custody of such child, and nothing in this act, or in the regulations of plans adopted hereunder shall be construed as limiting the power of a parent or guardian or person standing in loco parentis to determine what treatment or correction shall be provided for a child or the agency or agencies to be employed for such purpose."

Novena Of Peace Urged By Women's Catholic League

News Service) Utrecht, July 9. - A worldwide novena of prayer in order to obtain the "Peace of Christ" is being sponsored by the International Union of Catholic Women's Leagues, following resolutions adopted at the International Board, held in this city. Apostolic approval is being sought for the novena, which according to tentative plans, will be held from October 24 to November 1.

The Board protested against resolutions passed in Rome by the International Women Suffrage Alliance as being in contradiction with Catholic principles, which, the protest declares "alone sustain the rights and dignity of women through the indissolubility of marriage." "The Catholic principles," continues the protest, "agree with the rights of the father and mother over the child and uphold the spirit of duty and the purity of morals which make the united and prosperous families of a strong nation."

Mme. F. Steenberghe-Engerling of Holland was elected president of the Board and the Very Rev. Canon J. H. G. Jansen of Holland was chosen as chaplain. Other officers elected included: Princess Christina Guistiniani Bandini, Italy; Miss K. Balfe, England; Marquise de Chasteler, Belgium; Countess Desverny, France; Senora C. Garcia, Loygorri, Spain; Madame L. Nuyans de Roover, Belgium; Viscountess de Velard, France and Miss A. Meyer, Holland. Miss Meyer is secretary.

A telegram was received from Cardinal Gasparri indicating that the Holy Father acknowledged the faithfulness of the members of the Board and had bestowed upon them the apostolic benediction.

Bishop McCloskey In U. S.

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Philadelphia, July 20. - The Rt. Rev. James P. McCloskey, Bishop of Jaro in the Philippine Islands, has arrived here. He has come to the United States in the interests of his diocese which comprises more than 1,000,000 souls. Bishop McCloskey is a native of Philadelphia and was a judge, governors, mayors and sheriffs. It appears to the ignorant and prejudiced mind. It is 1917 when he was elevated to the episcopacy by Pope Benedict XV.

Catholic Is Chosen To Head Paris Bar

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Paris, July 13. - The Paris Bar Association has elected a new president to succeed the president whose term has just expired. It was thought at one time that the Association was inclined to elect M. Raymond Poincare who has long been a member of the Council of the Order of Barristers, but who has refused to become President of the Association because of his duties as head of the State. The Association therefore elected Maitre Manuel Fourcade by the unprecedented majority of 670 out of a total of 774 votes. The new President of the Paris Bar Association is not only a lawyer of great talent, but is a devout Catholic. He is president of the Parish Council of the Church of La Trinite, in Paris.

Methodist Bishop Denies Endorsing Soviet Government

News Service) New York, July 23. - A denial that he had at any time endorsed or given his support to the Soviet Government of Russia is made by Bishop Edgar Blake of the Methodist Church in a letter to the Christian Advocate. "The present form of government in Russia and the means and methods used for its support," said Bishop Blake, "I do not approve and have not at any time or in any way endorsed or given my support. The report that I said 'Tikhon has lost the game and must pay the penalty' has not the slightest truth in it. The only interviews I had in Russia or elsewhere regarding the Patriarch were with the representatives of the Soviet Government with whom I interceded in the Patriarch's behalf, and with certain leaders of the council, whom I urged to use their influence to prevent any personal harm coming to Tikhon."

Anglo-Catholics Show Increased Use Of Roman Ceremonies

News Service) London, July 16. - An enormous increase in the use of vestments, incense, and ceremonies usually considered distinctive of Catholic worship, was reported at the triennial convocation of the Anglo-Catholic Congress in London last week. One of the announcements made was to the effect that there are at least twenty Protestant churches in London where confessions are now heard. Approximately 20,000 persons attended the convocation.
