

Coment for China and Glassware, A cement for mending broken china and glassware may be made as follows: Mix a cupful of milk with a cupful of vinegar, then separate the curd from the whey and mix the whey with the whites of five eggs, beating the whole thoroughly together. When it is well mixed sift in a little quicklime and stir until the mixture is of the consistency of thick paste. Coment made in this way dries quickly.
