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Col. Callahan Will Address Mass Meeting

Colonel Patrick Henry Callahan, Louisville, Ky., will speak on "The Catholic Church and the Working Classes", at a mass meeting of the Catholic State League to be held at Convention Hall Sunday evening. He is a capitalist and originator of the Ryan-Callahan plan of profit-sharing partnership in industry. Colonel Callahan was Kentucky's chairman for its United War Drive and of its commission on the high cost of living; vice-president of the Inter-Racial Commission of Kentucky and one of the five citizens in charge of the \$2,000,000 Louisville Community Chest and of the seven appointed to construct the \$1,500,000 Soldiers' Memorial in Louisville. The late President Harding appointed Col. Callahan to represent the United States at the International Anti-Alcohol Congress at Geneva.

Made a knight of St. Gregory by the late Pope Pius XI, Col. Callahan has been a prominent worker in Catholic affairs, national and state. He was chairman of the Commission on Religious Prejudices 1914-1917, and of the Knights of Columbus War Work, 1917-1918; vice-president of the National Catholic Charities, Catholic Laymen's Association of Georgia and of the Catholic Press Association of the United States and Canada.

Colonel Callahan is a fluent, convincing speaker with pleasing platform personality. He will address the coming mass meeting, with the brilliant educator and lecturer, the Rev. Dr. Heinrich Schumacher of the Catholic University, Washington, D. C.

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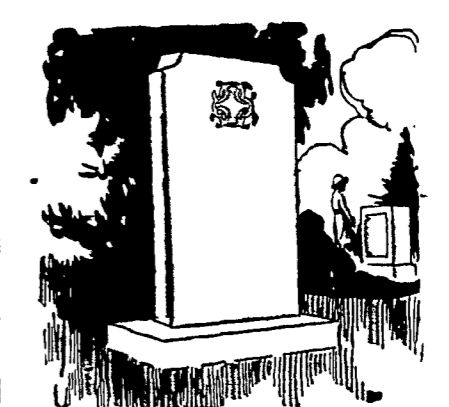
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
