Not only Great Britain and Gerthan the United States today, says a statement just issued by Lloyd's Regthe quarter ended September 30. In the past four years, it is pointed out, this country has fallen from first to sixth place among the shipbuilding nations of the world.

World Construction Less. World construction at the close of he quarter just ended was 'smaller than at any time since the close of the war, Lloyd's Register states, and this represents a decline of more than 165,000 gross tons, in comparison with the preceding quarter, ended June 30 last. In the last three months the aggregate of American construction decreased 34,000 tons, that for Great Britain and Ireland 66,000 tons and for all other countries combined 65,-000 tons.


