But there were Chancerlan refinements, nevertheless, aside from dishes of flowers; permissible foods imitating the form of meats on fast days, even eggs being counterfelted, and clever things such as making two capons out of one by skinning it and stuffing the skin. There were, besides, the points of etiquette: A pig for a lord should be endored, his cabbage tificked with egg, not crumbs; a pike served whole to a lord, but cut for the commonalty.
