

TO STUDY MINERAL WEALTH IN ALASKA

Survey of 36,000 Miles of Wilderness Planned

Washington.—In its latest search for valuable mineral wealth the government is sending a party of expert geologists and topographic engineers on a midwinter expedition to the tip of Alaska...

A few days ago the geological survey told the plans to send, at the expense of the Navy department, a small party of government technicians to northern Alaska to survey lands...

At Tanana, dog teams will be purchased and packers, camp hands and dog-team drivers will be employed.

From here on for a distance of 700 miles, over a vast stretch of tundra, the expedition will have to use kerosene for cooking food...

By this time the summer season will be near at hand and sledding no longer will be possible. One party of four will then return to the cache on the headwater stream of the Colville...

After the ice breaks, the parties will descend the stream, mapping them and the surrounding country in addition to making geological researches.

The Colville party later will make a foraging trip across country to the Chippewee River and descend it to the Dease inlet, a bay lying about twenty-five miles east of Point Barrow.
