Place BLUE RIBBON HAM in a kettle of cold water, bring to a boil, there simmer until tender, allowing one half hour to the pound. Remove from kettle, place in baking pan, rind side up. Loosen up rand sufficiently so as to permit sprienkling fat of ham with brown sugar, then cover over with rind. Mix a cupful of cooking liquid with one cupful cider or one third cupful cider vinegar. pour over ham and bake in moderate oven for two hours, basting often. To brown, take ham from oven, remove rind, place coves in fat of ham, sprinkle with bread or cracker crumbs and return to oven for one half hour or until nicely belown.
