Catholic Customs And Symbols

The Symbolism of the Scapular

In religious nomenclature, the
word scapular is ambiguous. It may
refer to that most important part

The word itself comes from the
Latin (scapulae, the shoulders; scapularis,
pertaining to the shoulders),
and obviously suits all forms of the
scapulars, large or small. For the

As the opening in the center of the
M. S. permitted the garment to rest
on the shoulders, the M. S. was often
styled Jugum Christi, i. e. the yoke

The original form of the Domini-
can scapular provided a segment for
covering the head. This became in
time the "hood." The scapular was
called the scutum (Latin for shield),

Less suggestive of symbolism, how-
ever, is the "scapular medal" which
the Holy See, in 1910, permitted as
a substitute for the L. S. Worn con-
