### Pope Gives Special Edition Of Breviary To St. Peter's Chapter

Rome, July 21.—A special edition of the Breviary used by the Chapter of St. Peter's is being prepared by the Vatican Printing Office as a gift from Pope Pius XI to the Chapter.

The Chapter of St. Peter's, in harmony with an ancient tradition, does not use the Latin text of the Scriptures in the recitation of the daily office, but adheres to a text of the "Italia Antiqua" which differs somewhat in form from that adopted for the use of the Universal Church.

The Pope has now ordered an edition of 1,000 copies to be printed. They will not be sold, but will be given to the Chapter as an organizational canon.

### Cardinal Hayes Gives Warm Endorsement To Holy Name Congress

New York, July 29.—The National Holy Name Convention to be held in Washington September 18-20 next, has been endorsed by His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York.

In a letter to the Very Rev. Michael J. Ripple, O.P., P.G.S., National Director, His Eminence said that he trusts that his diocese will be well represented at the Convention.

Cardinal Hayes' letter reads in part, as follows: "I am pleased to learn of the approaching Holy Name Convention at Washington in September. I am sure that the high and holy purpose of convening in the Capitol of the Nation, thousands of our Catholic men who openly proclaim their loyalty to Christ our Lord and their devotion to His Sacred Name, will make for a more ardent attachment to religion, a deeper reverence for authority Divine and human, and greater love for our beloved country."

It is expected that ten thousand delegates representing the 6,000 branches of the Society in this country will attend the Convention.

### Father Of Maryknoll Missions Superior Dies At Age Of 91

Boston, August 1.—At the advanced age of ninety-one years, Mr. James Walsh, a well known resident of Cambridge, Mass., died last week at his home in that city.

Mr. Walsh was a native of Ireland and came to United States in 1855. He retired from business some twenty years ago, but was active until a few days of his death.

He was the father of the Very Rev. James A. Walsh, Superior of the American Foreign Missions of Maryknoll, and of Mr. Timothy Walsh, the well known ecclesiastical architect who is associated with Mr. Charles D. Maginnis. Both Father Walsh and his brother are natives of Boston.
