

Capt. McCullagh Here To Lecture On Russia And Bolshevik Policy

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) New York, Nov. 7.—Capt. Francis McCullagh, the journalist whose dispatches on the Soviet government's persecution of churches, with definite proof that the Bolshevik aim was to suppress every vestige of religion from the Russian people, started America some months ago, arrived in New York this week for a stay of some time in the United States.

Franciscan Convent At Jaffa Loses Its Suit Over Lands

News Service) Jerusalem, Oct. 27.—The Spanish Crown has been adjudged legal owner of certain lands adjoining the Franciscan Convent at Jaffa which have been the subject of litigation for the past three years. Originally the lands were bought with money supplied by the Spanish Government but with the understanding that the purchase was made for the benefit of the convent.

Police Investigate Mysterious Death Of Enemy of Klan

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Whitfield, N. H., Nov. 7.—Police here are awaiting the results of an autopsy by Dr. H. N. Kingsford, State Pathologist, before proceeding further in their investigation of the death of James Travis, past Grand Knight of the local council of the Knights of Columbia. Travis' body was found in a mill pond near here Wednesday. No outward signs of violence were revealed beyond a few slight bruises and pending an examination of the vital organs, the official report on the death was withheld.

Judge Gary Receives Medallion From Pope

New York, Nov. 7.—Pope Pius XI has honored Judge Albert H. Gary, of the United States Steel Corporation, and James Farrell, president of the corporation, for their leadership in the industrial and commercial life of America. It became known upon the arrival here Saturday of the Rt. Rev. John M. Gannon, Bishop of the diocese, a visitation to Rome.

St. Columban Society Head Is Appointed Prefect Apostolic

St. Columban, Neb., Nov. 8.—Information has been received at St. Columban's Seminary here that the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward J. Galvin, founder of the Missionary Society of St. Columban, has been named Prefect Apostolic of Han Yang, Hupeh, China. He has been director of the missionary endeavors of the Society in the Prefecture for the past four years.

Seminary To Train Priests In Germany For Work In America

Cologne, Nov. 1.—A new missionary for the training of German priests to take care of the spiritual wants of German emigrants abroad has been opened at Godesburg near Bonn in the Archdiocese of Cologne. The Rt. Rev. F. X. Geyer, Titular Bishop of Trocenede, who served for many years as a missionary in America, is at the head of the new institution.

Pauper Who Was Sent To Lourdes By Poor Law Guardians Well

London, Nov. 1.—The Poor Law inmate sent to Lourdes by the Southwark Board of Guardians at the public expense, has returned from her pilgrimage. Her first request on returning was for her discharge from the institution, on the ground that she was now quite well. This was granted by the guardians, who were so interested in the case that they asked the woman's doctor to make a report on her condition.

Young Men's Fitness To Be Family Head

Paris, Oct. 31.—The National Congress of the Catholic Association of French Youth, to be held in Nantes in April, 1925, will be devoted to the discussion of "The Preparation of the Young Man to be the Head of the Family."

Fr. Himmel, Former Georgetown Head, Dies At University

J., for fifty years a member of Georgetown and once president of Georgetown University here, died Monday at the university following an attack of acute indigestion. He observed the golden anniversary of his membership in the Society of Jesus only last year. He was sixty-nine years old.

Student Fitness Test Being Applied At Catholic Schools
