**Clancy Is
Expert Mover**

Spring is the time for moving. From the beginning to the end of time people will do their moving in the Spring, especially in the Northern climate. Those who move have to employ a moving van to transport their household goods and that's where George M. Clancy Inc. comes in for a large amount of business.

George Clancy, head of the firm, has developed the business of moving furniture to a fine science. They do not move things in a haphazard way but do use scientific methods in their business. When they carry out the dishes, furniture or pictures and pack them in their large and roomy moving vans, they are careful to avoid breakage.

Three of the Clancy trucks have a capacity to hold the furniture of the ordinary seven room house, the largest truck will comfortably hold the furniture of an eight room house. It pays to buy good coal, to many people coal is coal, but there is as much difference in coal as there is in anything else you buy. People are asking themselves at this time of year:

"Why should I put coal in my cellar?" That is the question which some home owners do not understand.

In the April letter of this company, the fact was brought out that beside the immediate saving on the lower Spring prices prevailing this year there is a greater saving due to the stabilized production of the mine. Though this is an extremely important factor, little if any thought is given it by the consumer who on the average places his order early enough to have it out of the way and not something to be faced in the troubles of the Winter weather.

To maintain a uniform production, the product must be moved to the consumer's bin. Fifty million tons of anthracite coal is distributed annually over the Northern, Eastern and Central portions of the United States.

If the users of these fifty million tons of coal were delayed by people not wanting coal until Fall, the railroads would have to put on more freights and the distributors would have to enlarge their storage facilities which would result in larger carrying charges in the slack period or an overtaxing of the equipment and probability of not being able to fill orders where required.

The wholesalers would have to enlarge their storage houses which would mean added cost to the consumer in the end.

Anthracite undergoes an extensive and expensive manufacturing of impurities and separated into various sizes demanded by the public.

Of the 150,000 men employed in the anthracite mines only about 40,000 actually mine the coal. About 108,000 men are inside and outside the mines loading and hauling coal driving and maintaining gangways and preparing the coal for market.

Everyday, 800 million gallons of water are pumped from the anthracite mines and 50 million pounds of explosives and 775,000 tons of lumber are used annually.

Every minute, two tons of air must be fed into the mines for ventilation. It is not humanely possible to perform all of this work in the short space of time in which coal is needed in the home during the Fall and Winter periods.

Reviewing these facts, it is essential that the home owner get his coal early and avoid extra expense. Early buyers benefit by a lower price per ton.
