Hardwood Floors For the New Home

If you are building a new house or remodeling an old one you are of course, considering the best floors, and those are hard wood ones. The best authority on these is always the only one to consider. Hardwoods are never used for outside work because when they are subjected to dampness they warp and swell so badly that the floor may be ruined. Certain hard woods like Maple are especially subject to change under conditions of dampness. When this material is laid for flooring care must be taken to allow for subsequent expansion but it makes a fine floor when properly laid.

One of the first principles of laying a floor is to get it tight. With oak flooring nails should be set—that is driven far into wood by means of a steel tool. The purpose of this is to bring the wood sections close together.

Subsequently the dry air of your apartment may dry your flooring and make it shrink. This may open the joints to a slight extent. Modern methods of flooring manufacture have developed a very superior product. Mr. Leonard Smith is an expert at the flooring business, and can give you much more information at first hand.
