

Priest's Plan To Cut Living Cost In Spain

(By N. C. W. C. News Service). Madrid, Sept. 12.—Don Domingo Bueno, Canon of Tuy, acting for the Federation of Catholic Agrarian Syndicates of Galicia, recently asked the Military Directorate for an advance of one million pesetas for the work of the rural slaughter houses.

It is easy to understand the years of efforts, as difficult as they were fruitless, to obtain from the Spanish Government this money for a purely religious undertaking. The cattle interests of Castile and Andalusia were opposed to it.

The plan developed by Canon Bueno may be summed up as follows: The slaughter houses are cooperative concerns, operated by associations of small farmers, and although they were devised and are to be built by the Catholic syndicates they will exclude no one.

Consumers Will Benefit According to the calculations of Canon Bueno, the profits under the new plan, even on the present scale of production, will be 37,000,000 pesetas, which will be divided between producers and consumers.

Work Already Begun. Ten slaughter houses are to be built in different parts of Galicia, chosen because of production and transportation facilities.

When Canon Bueno presented the plans and technical information concerning the slaughter houses to the Military Directorate, General Primo de Rivera was greatly impressed.

Denmark is the other agricultural nation which like Spain, has established cooperative slaughter houses on a large scale.

Cardinal Fruhwirth Honored At Rome On Eightieth Birthday

(Rome Correspondent, N. C. W. C. News Service). Rome, Sept. 14.—Rome has in the last few days been paying grateful honor to His Eminence Andrew Cardinal Fruhwirth, Major Penitentiary whose eightieth birthday has just taken place.

Cardinal Fruhwirth, a member of the Dominican Order and an Austrian by birth, is one of the most notable members of the Sacred College today.

Born in 1845 at St. Anna on the Algen in Stiria, His Eminence entered the Order of Preachers in the Monastery of Saint Anna of Graz in 1863.

Having completed his studies at Rome, he was successively a professor at the Dominican Monastery at Graz, Prior of the Monastery of Vienna, Provincial of the Austro-Hungarian Province of his order, Counsellor of Cardinal Ganglbauer's Consistory, again Provincial, 75th Superior General of the Dominican Order at the early age of 48.

Catholic Social Workers Of World To Gather In Milan

Milan, Sept. 12.—A movement expected to awaken a wider interest in Catholic Social Service work through the creation of an International Catholic Social Service Union and the establishment of Catholic schools of social service in all countries will be launched at the first meeting of the International Catholic Social Service Union to be held in this city from October 17th to 19th inclusive.

The invitation to the meeting is addressed especially to graduates and students of existing Catholic schools of social service, but representatives of all the larger Catholic women's organizations and professional organizations will be admitted as auditors and may take part in the discussions.

The delegates from social service schools will present formal reports of the work done in these institutions, and round table discussions of the theoretical and practical training of women for social service work under Catholic auspices will be a feature of the various sessions.

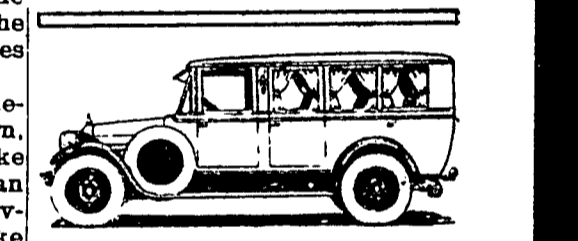
Young Holy Ghost Priest Sails For African Missions
