First Use of Scissors

It was formerly believed that scissors were invented in Venice in the Sixteenth century, but records show that implements similar to our modern scissors were in use very much earlier Pompell shears were found made of. iron and steel, as well as bronze. Scissors were also in use in various oriental countries from a very early period. It is stated that those manufactured in Europe were copied from the Persian. The Oriental scissors were very much ornamented and frequently in the form of a bird, the blade forming the beak.

Nuts Classed as Fruits

In botany the fruit of a flowering plant is the matured seed vessel, and its contents together with such accessory parts as become finally incorporated with them. Thus in a botanical sense not only apples, grapes, etc., but all berries, nuts, grains, beans, pumpkins, cucumbers, etc., are fruits. Popular usage has become much narrower. The grains have been dropped, and the tendency is to drop nuts also, so that a fruit is now generally understood to be the fleshy, julcy prodnct of some plant which when ripe is edible without cooking and adapted to use as a dessert.

Life's Span Extended

In 1800 the average length of life was thirty-three years, in 1855 it was forty years and in 1920 it was fiftyeight years. Actuaries of the large insurance companies report that within the last 50 years the span of human life has been lengthened ten years. GOOD THINGS TO EAT

For a change from the every-day muffin here is a good one to try: Rice Muffins,-



To two well-besten eggs add one cupful of milk. one teaspoonful of salt, one tablespoonful of sugar. three cupfuls of

flour sifted with three teaspoonfuls of baking powder; add one cupful of boiled rice and five tablespoonfuls of melted butter. Stir lightly and bake in muffin pans.

Asparagus Cream Salad .- Dissolve two tablespoonfuls of gelatin in onehalf cupful of cold water, add one cupful of boiling water and cool. Rub one can of asparagus through a very coarse sieve, or cut it into small pieces. When the gelatin has dissolved and cooled add the asparagus, one cupful of pecans, one cupful of grated cheese and a few dashes of cayenne. Whip one cupful of heavy cream until thick and fold into the mixture. Let it harden in molds. Serve on lettuce with mayonnaise.

Stuffed Egg Salad.—Cut six hard cooked eggs into halves lengthwise and remove the yolks. Cream four tablespoonfuls of butter and mix with the egg yolks; add six skinned and boned sardines to the egg yolks and stuff the whites with the mixture Serve on head lettuce with a mayon naise dressing.

Pimento Butter Sandwiches.—Cui white bread into one-fourth inch slices Spread generously with pimento butter; spread lettuce leaves with mayonnaise and place between each pair of slices. Press edges lightly and cut into triangles. To prepare the pi mento butter, cream one-half cupful of butter. Drain the liquor from a can of pimentoes, rinse with cold water and dry. Rub the peppers through a sieve and gradually work the pulp into the butter; season with sait. If the pimentoes are small, use four.
