



### Cardinal Dubois Spends Busy Day In The Capital

Washington, July 19.—His Eminence Louis Ernest Cardinal Dubois, Archbishop of Paris, and his party returning from the Eucharistic Congress, left Washington recently after a visit of 40 hours into which they crowded an immense amount of activity.

With His Eminence were the Most Rev. A. F. Leynaud, Archbishop of Algiers; Bishop Grente of Le Mans; Bishop Chatal, Auxiliary of Paris and "Bishop of Foreigners" in that city; Canon Delabar, Vicar General of Paris, and Canon P. Flynn, pastor of Madeleine Church in Paris. The Rev. Joseph Bruneau, S.S., of St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, accompanied His Eminence's party to this city and left immediately to prepare for their arrival in Baltimore. The Very Rev. Augustin N. Aretbal, S. P. M., rector of Notre Dame Church, New York City, was a member of the party visiting here.

Cardinal Dubois and his associates spent but a few hours in Baltimore. They then went to New York whence they sail for home Wednesday aboard the Berengaria. They will arrive in Cherbourg July 20.

The purpose of Cardinal Dubois' visit here was to inspect the Catholic University of America, where he was the general impression gained from the guest of the Rt. Rev. Bishop Thomas J. Shahan, rector of the Catholic all along.

### University. After a survey of the State Department and later placed a wreath on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington where His Eminence recited the De Profundis. The party also visited the headquarters of the N. C. W. C. here.

In the course of the visit the distinguished prelates from France also visited Trinity College, Georgetown College, the United States Soldiers' Home, Lincoln Memorial and other historic sites.

**Delighted With Shrine**

But what of all was most inspiring to His Eminence was the great hope for the future the Catholic University of America offers and the magnitude that is being wrought into the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on the campus of the University.

The Shrine was the first place Cardinal Dubois and the Archbishop and Bishops visited after their arrival here. They were lavish in their praise of the edifice, the crypt of which is now complete.

### Church Designer Becomes Catholic

London, July 10.—E. Bower Norris, designer of many Catholic churches, schools and other parish buildings in England, has been received into the Catholic Church, it has just been announced.

His conversion came as a surprise, the general impression being that he had been a member of the Anglican Church.

## Irish Government Grants \$10,000,000 For Sugar Factory

Dublin, July 12.—Headed by the Most Rev. Patrick Foley, Bishop of Kildare and Leighlin, the clergy and parliamentary representatives of nine counties have founded a beet growers' association with its center in Carlow.

This association is to instruct the farmers in the large scale cultivation and marketing of beet root, which is an infant industry in Ireland. A Government grant of \$10,000,000 has been devoted to building an up-to-date factory for the manufacture of sugar. This is the first such factory in Ireland. It will be ready to open work in October.

Great hopes are entertained that the establishment of this factory will reduce the depression in farming caused by periodical slumps in the cattle trade. It is recognized however, that the Irish farmer is a bad organizer, and that the new industry might suffer from irregular supplies.

"I have felt" said Bishop Foley "that a beet growers' association is indispensable to the success of this great industry which is about to be set up in your midst. Unless the growers provide the proper quality and quantity of beet, the results of the factory must be disappointing."

The organizer of the Irish Farmers' Parliamentary Party, Senator O'Hanlon, and Deputy D. J. Gorey,

Chairman of the Party, have arranged that their Party shall work in friendly conjunction with the new association. Both of these gentlemen are Catholics.

The Rev. J. Killman, Administrator of the Bishop's parish at Carlow, will supervise the management of the organization in that county. Mr. J. Conlon T. D. and Mr. Hefferman T. D., will look after its interests in other areas.

The Association embraces the following counties:—Carlow, Wicklow, King's (now known officially by its old Gaelic name of Leix) Tipperary, Kilkenny, Wexford Waterford and Louth.



the office of the First Trust and Deposit Company. He was rushed to the hospital and died about six hours later. Msgr. James P. McPeak, rector of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, and the Rev. B. Clovis Thibault, pastor of St. Joseph's Church gave Father Quinn Extreme Unction.

Monsignor Quinn was born in Syracuse December 26, 1862. He was ordained on June 4, 1887. His first pastorate was St. Matthew's Church, East Syracuse. He was a chosen pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Church when his parish was organized. He said his first Mass in the new parish, June 2, 1901. In observing its 25th anniversary on June 6, the parish also dedicated its new school, a project in which Monsignor Quinn was deeply interested. Pope Pius XI elevated Father Quinn to the rank of Monsignor in March.

## Fr. Trollope Once London Actor, Joins Redemptorist Order

London, July 10.—Once a well known actor on the London stage, Father George Trollope, Administrator of St. Barnabas' Cathedral, Nottingham, has resigned his post to enter the Redemptorist Order.

Father Trollope went on the stage soon after leaving the Merchant Taylor's School. A few years later, while still in his early twenties, he was received into the Church and went to study for the priesthood.

After he had been rector of Workson for six years, Bishop Dunn discovered in the former actor an efficient organizer, and made him Administrator of the Cathedral.

## French Commissioner In Syria Lauds Work Done By Missionaries

Geneva, July 8.—M. Henry de Jouvenel, French High Commissioner in Syria, in his report to the Commission on Mandates of the League of Nations, has spoken in words of high praise of the missionary establishments in that country.

To take the establishments maintained in the Holy Land by the Franciscans alone, M. de Jouvenel reported that they feed, clothe and give complete shelter to twelve thousand poor persons a year. They maintain sixty residences, with schools for boys and girls, and the bringing up and educating five thousand pupils free of charge. They have three hundred and sixty children in several orphanages and have opened dispensaries to care for the sick.
