Rev. F. X. Miller, C.S.S.R.**

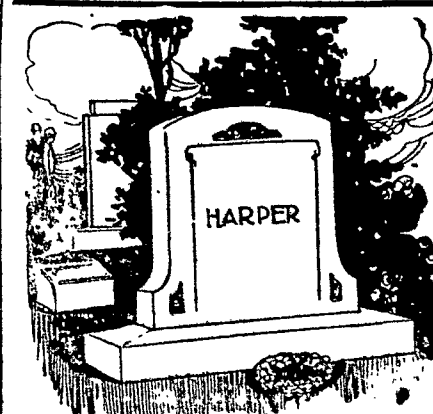

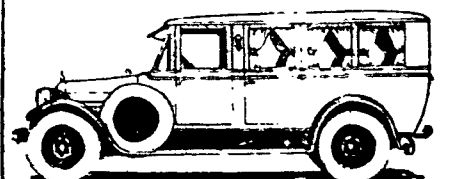
