Workers of Ulster
In Grave Distress
(By N. C. W. C. News Service)

Dublin, Aug. 6.—The quarterly meeting of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul in Ulster, announces a great increase in the amount of distress in Northern Ireland, particularly in Belfast. This is in a large measure due to the importation of French and Belgian linen, which can be bought cheaply owing to the depreciation of the franc, and imported into Northern Ireland at less than the local cost of production. In addition, the continental linen trade has been enabled completely to oust the Ulster manufacturer from the London market, the biggest in Europe.

Foreseeing these difficulties, the linen trade of Ulster combined some time ago with the trade in England and Scotland, and applied for an inquiry under the safeguarding of industries regulations, with the object of having a protective tariff imposed on linen imported into England and Northern Ireland. This request was refused, with the result that the trade is now ruined.

Meanwhile, statistics show that the long expected revival of trade in the Free State, is not far off, if it has not been actually begun. For the last month, the number of business failures has been the lowest for any given month in the last three years.

New Catholic Church
For Beaconsfield,
Chesterton's Town

London, August 7.—Beaconsfield, where G. K. Chesterton lives, is soon to have its little church, the first stone of which was laid this week by the Bishop of Northampton. For several years Mass has been said in a shed at the back of the Railway hotel. It was in this shed, actually part of the inn, that Chesterton was received into the Church, by Father John O'Connor, who is the "Father Brown" of Chesterton's quaint detective stories.

On the morning of his reception, "Father Brown" once told me, Chesterton chose his walking cane with great deliberation, taking one which had been given to him by the Knights of Columbus in America.

"Thus fortified," said Father Brown, "he walked to the city on the hill."

Chesterton was present this week at the stone laying.
