

Mount Angel Fire Destroys College Of Benedictines

(Special Telegraph, N.C.W.C. News Service) Mount Angel, Ore., Sept. 22.—Mount Angel College and St. Benedict's Abbey were completely destroyed in a disastrous fire September 21 with a loss estimated from \$800,000 to \$1,000,000.

The catastrophe has wiped away in a single night the results of years of toil by the Benedictine Fathers here. The stone for the magnificent buildings which now lay in smoldering ruins was quarried by hand by the fathers and members of the religious community through years of hard and painstaking labor.

Fire Started in Garage A short circuit in one of the auto mobiles in the garage is believed to have caused the fire, which quickly spread to the large gymnasium.

Small chapel in the cemetery where the Right Rev. Abbot Bernard Murphy, O. S. B., remained on guard. Practically everything of great value was rescued from the chapel with the exception of the altars and the pipe organ.

Students Saved Belongings Registration in the college was on September 20, the day before the disaster. One hundred and seventy-five students registered. The majority of students succeeded in saving their personal belongings.

Institution To Be Rebuilt Temporary housing arrangements have been made until plans for rebuilding are formulated. Rev. Alcibi Helbel, O.S.B., rector of the Mount Angel College which has received a severe setback in its development.

MEXICAN HIERARCHY MADE NO PROPOSAL BY PRES. CALLES

(Special Mexican Correspondence, N. C. W. C. News Service) Mexico City, Sept. 24.—The Archbishop of Mexico City, Msgr. Jose Mora y del Rio, replying to a message from the N. C. W. C. News Service, has issued a formal denial of reports printed in the American press to the effect that the Mexican Government is considering the return of the churches provided the hierarchy will sever all relations with Rome.

Meanwhile, all reports bear out the prediction of a prolonged deadlock in the conflict between the Catholics and the Calles Administration.
