"Distributists" Will Push Chesterton's Economic Program

London, September 30.—The League of distributists which was inspired by the imminent demise of "G. K.'s Weekly", and is designed to spread the economic theories of G. K. Chesterton and those who think with him politically, was born this week at a meeting addressed by both Mr. Chesterton and Hilaire Belloc.
The League does not yet possess a name. The task of choosing one has been delegated to a committee nominated by Mr. Chesterton. Their choice will have to be ratified by the members. The word "Distributism" does not appear to be popular, and will probably be avoided.
Mr. Belloc declared they wanted to create an England where fifty years hence the number of people possessed of private property in stocks and shares and houses would be in larger proportion than now. In Denmark distributism was working almost at a maximum, and in Ireland it was advancing rapidly, he said.
"G. K.'s Weekly" will continue "a little longer" owing to generous assistance, it is stated officially.

Notre Dame Squad And Naval Cadets To Play In 1927-8

Chicago, Oct. 5.—Notre Dame University and the U. S. Naval Academy will meet on the gridiron, Oct. 15, 1927, and at a corresponding date in 1928, it was announced officially by Knute K. Rockne, athletic director of Notre Dame, tonight. The 1927 game will be played in Chicago and the 1928 contest in Baltimore.
The Notre Dame-Army game will be played in New York in 1927, but there is a possibility that the Cadets will come west to battle Rockne's eleven in 1928.

Msgr. Barry-Doyle Goes To Near East

New York, Oct. 8.—The Right Rev. Msgr. R. Barry-Doyle, whose work for Greece and the Near East been taken over by the American Hierarchy and raised to a Pontifical Institution, has departed for Athens and Constantinople to visit the orphanage, schools, seminary and other institutions brought into existence by his work in the United States.
Although Monsignor Barry-Doyle worked for the establishment of these institutions he never saw them. His present trip is one of business, pleasure and joy—to see the fruits of his efforts, he says.

School To Foster Belated Vocations Begins With 200.

Oriskany, N. Y., Oct. 8.—Two hundred young men from business, the professions and civil service have applied for admission to the Syracuse House of Studies for Belated Vocations to the Priesthood, which opened on the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.
In this school a special and intensive course of studies and a distinctive spirit necessary to take the place of college associations which late vocations have lacked in the years of their youthful education will be offered. The school is for young men, and no student under 21 years of age will be accepted. There are many young men who wish to study for the priesthood but feel they would not make progress by entering the classroom with youths 14 or 15 years of age. At Oriskany the applicants will find an opportunity to follow their vocation, to make six years preparatory work in three.
After completing a full classical course they will be sent to a seminary to begin the study of philosophy.
In connection with the opening of the school the Rt. Rev. Daniel J. Curley, Bishop of Syracuse, issued an official letter endorsing the Institution and stating that His Holiness Pope Pius XI assured him during a recent audience that he would pray that God would liberally sustain the work to heroic and blessed achievement.
The Rev. Jeremiah P. O'Mahoney is founder of the school. Bernard M. Drass, former head of the department of education of Mt. Mary's Seminary, Emmitsburg, Md., is headmaster under Father O'Mahoney. Two other laymen compose the faculty.

Clergy Pay Honors To Msgr. Vaughan, Bishop Of Menevia

Francis Vaughan whilst he was at Barry Dock assembled there this week to wish him godspeed on his departure for Wrexham to take up duties as Bishop of Menevia. All the religious denominations in Barry were represented at the farewell and Councillor W. Bock, Chairman of the District Council, who is a Wesleyan, presided.
The Chairman said it was the first time in the history of Barry that there had been official civic recognition of the departure of a minister.
