## Priest-Historian Seeks Old Papers Sold To American

Grenada, B. W. I., Nov. 5.—The Rev. Raymond Devas, O. P., P. P., who is collecting material for a history of the Church in these parts, has been balked by his inability to obtain early copies of a newspaper, all of which were sold to an unknown American. Father Devas is now seeking the American.

It appears that it is very important to Father Devas' history that he study early copies of St. George's Chronicle. The copies of this paper from 1784 onward were sold to the American, whose name and address Father Devas has been unable to learn, thirty some years ago. Searches in the libraries of England, the United States and the British West Indies have produced no satisfactory results.

Father Devas' plea is that the owner or owners of old newspapers of Grenada, British West Indies, communicate with the Grenada Guardian, Grenada.

## Cardinal's Appeal Inspired By Pope, Saves Milan Paper

Milan, Nov. 5.—The Catholic Daily "L'Italia", which was on the point of suspending publication as a result of competition on the part of the great Fascist or Pro-Fascist dailies "Il Secolo", "Il Corriere della Sera", etc., has been saved by the energetic action of Cardinal Tosi, Archbishop of Milan. Cardinal Tosi acted in response to an urgent recommendation sent him by Pope Pius XI who was Cardinal Archbishop of Milan before his elevation to the Papacy and who has shown an unflagging interest in the Catholic press.

In an appeal sent out broadcast through the diocese, Cardinal Tosi declared that it would be shameful for Milan, the foremost diocese of Italy and one of the wealthiest, to allow its sole Catholic daily to succumb for want of support.

"It is not only a need but a duty," he said, "for us to keep in touch with the news of the world. It is a real duty to follow day by day the history of the Church throughout the world, rejoicing over her triumphs and sharing in her sorrows. Is not the press a sort of apostolate? Does not the Catholic press preach outside of the church? Is it not the greatest aid of many pastors who cannot sow good seed outside the range of their voice?"

The Cardinal's appeal brought a most generous response. Not only in the "Italia" safe but there has been a widespread renewal of interest in the Catholic press in general throughout the diocese.

## Fear In Palestine Soviet Will Seize Orthodox Churches

Jerusalem, Nov. 5.—A furor has been caused in the Orthodox community of Palestine by the report that the Greek Orthodox patriarch here, Megr. Lamianca, has recognized the "Living Church," now the official Orthodox Church in Soviet Russia.

Fear has immediately sprung up that such action will result in the seizure of all Russian Church properties in Palestine, valued at many hundreds of thousands of pounds. These forebodings arise because the Greek patriarch here has been regarded under the rules of the Oriental Christian church, as the father and nominal patron of Russian Orthodox Christians in Palestine. If he, their protector, has recognized the Soviet Church, say the Russian Orthodox people here, there is no hindrance to the Soviet Government claiming the church property in the country.

There are many, however, who believe that the reported recognition of the "Living Church" by Megr. Lamianca is only a political gesture by the patriarch to win from the English authorities a more indulgent policy.

## Catholic Kinsman Of Lord North, Foe Of America, Is 90

London, Nov. 5.—Lord North of Kintling, who celebrated his 90th birthday recently, is separated by only two generations from his famous ancestor under whom Britain lost America.

He was received into the Church with Lady North in 1867.

Though Lord North is the tenth in line, he counts as the eleventh owing to the curious arithmetic of the peerage. There was actually no tenth Lord North. The place of the tenth was taken by two sisters in succession, daughters of the ninth baron, and the Heraldic College appears to count each of them as only one half.

## Card. Hayes Visits Denver To Dedicate Diocesan Seminary

Denver, Nov. 5.—One of the largest gatherings of Catholics ever assembled in Colorado witnessed the dedication of the new St. Thomas Seminary here recently by His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York. The Most Rev. John J. Glennon, Archbishop of St. Louis, and the Rt. Rev. J. Henry Thien, Bishop of Denver, assisted at the ceremony with a number of Bishops, monsignori, priests and seminarians, Archbishop Glennon delivered the dedicatory sermon.

Cardinal Hayes reviewed a procession of students from Catholic schools, colleges, and universities of Denver and its vicinity, and these, after passing in review, assembled before the altar and listened to a brief address from His Eminence, who spoke of the need for the Church in the world today saying: "Peace and good will among men and nations is necessary to the settlement of the difficulties of the world."

## Feast Of Christ's Kingship Observed In Omaha Stadium

Omaha, Nov. 4.—The Catholics of Omaha turned out in large numbers to attend the monster celebration for the feast of Christ the King, on Sunday, October 31, in the new stadium of Creighton University.

Priests from every parish, acolytes from all the churches, Sisters from the various Omaha convents and the faithful, ranging from infants in arms to those bent with age, responded to the call to pay homage to the King of Kings.

A beautiful, canopied altar, banked in palms, had been erected in the stadium. The crowd had flowed over into the upper tiers of the stadium, but the altar was visible to all.

Bishop Beckman, apostolic administrator of the diocese of Omaha delivered an address, which was audible to every listener. He emphasized the domination of Christ the King, over society and state as well as over individual. "The Kingship of Jesus Christ is not to be taken in a figurative sense," said Bishop Beckman. "Christ, the noblest figure in all literature, history and religion, has all the authority of a King. He commands in Himself all the functions of government, the legislative, the judicial and the executive. His kingship is enthroned, not in castles or marble, but in the hearts of men, in society and all creation. Jesus Christ Himself said: 'All power is given to Me in heaven and on earth. He proved His power over all creation.'

The combined choir of the Knights of Columbus and Creighton University led the congregational singing. All recited the act of consecration, prescribed by the Holy Father. During the Benediction, as Christ the King was elevated, a banner, bearing the name of St. Commander in Chief," as the military presented sword.

## Marquette's Squad Captain Voted Most Popular Athlete

Wilwaukee, Wis., Nov. 5.—LaVern Dilweg, captain of Marquette University's football team in 1924 and an "All-American" end in 1925, was declared "the most popular athlete in Wisconsin" by a statewide poll conducted in a local newspaper as a part of a national campaign.

Football players, baseball players, golfers, tennis players and swimmers were entered in the contest, but Dilweg won easily in this state. Fred Schutte, outfielder of the Milwaukee American Association baseball team, who has been sold to the St. Louis "Browns," was the second most popular athlete in the state, while "Red" Dunn, Marquette's "All-American" quarterback in 1923, was third.

## Fr. John Ryan, S. J., English Priest, Dies

London, Oct. 25.—Father John Ryan, S. J., who has worked in Jamaica and South Africa, died at St. Beuno's College, St. Asaph, this week aged 84, having completed more than half a century as a priest of the Society of Jesus. He held many appointments in England and was in charge of the famous shrine of St. Winefride, Holywell, from 1905 until his retirement last year.
