Blood to Sick Poor. Is Yule Gift of 307 St. Louis U. Students

St. Louis, Dec. 31 .- On the eve of Christmas, 307 students of the Dental and Medical schoos of St. Louis University, signed a pledge to donate a pint of blood each for transfusion, when desired, in the cases of free patients at the City Hospital and at the hospitals that are associated with the University, St. Marys Hospital, St. Mary's Infirmary, Mt St Rose Sanitorium, St Anthony's Hospital, St. John's and Alexian

Brothers' Hospital. The pledges are the students' Christmas gifts to the sick poor. Some days ago Dean Hanau Loeb of the Medical School asked students to register for blood transfusion, at the usual fee of \$50 a pint. Then members of the faculty already had registered The reason was that it is difficult to find enough persons willing to give blood when the necessity appears suddenly The students answered the call by spontaneously offering their blood free to the poor They will submit to the operation not more than once in all months

This is said to be the first mass donation of the kind ever made in the United States by college students. It recalls the noble service rendered by St Louis University students during the influenza epidemic in the war, when the entire Senior Class worked night and day for the relief of the sufferers. disregarding the ever-present danger of infection.
